Any change to existing contracts that adds work or changes contract cost, and were not included in the original contract, must be approved by the Property and Procurement Office and the Attorney General's Office (as to form) prior to the implementation of the change or commencement of work affected by the change.

25. WAIVER: The failure of either party to insist upon a strict performance of any of the terms or provision of this Contract, or to exercise any option, right, or remedy herein contained, shall not be construed as a waiver or a relinquishment for the future of such term, provision, option, right, or remedy, but the same shall continue in full force and effect. Any waiver must be expressly stated in writing and signed by the waiving party.

26. 31. If the reduced bid or offer prices are made in writing and supersede the prior bid or offer prices, all bids or offers, including the reduced bid, or offer prices, will be reevaluated in accordance with this rule.

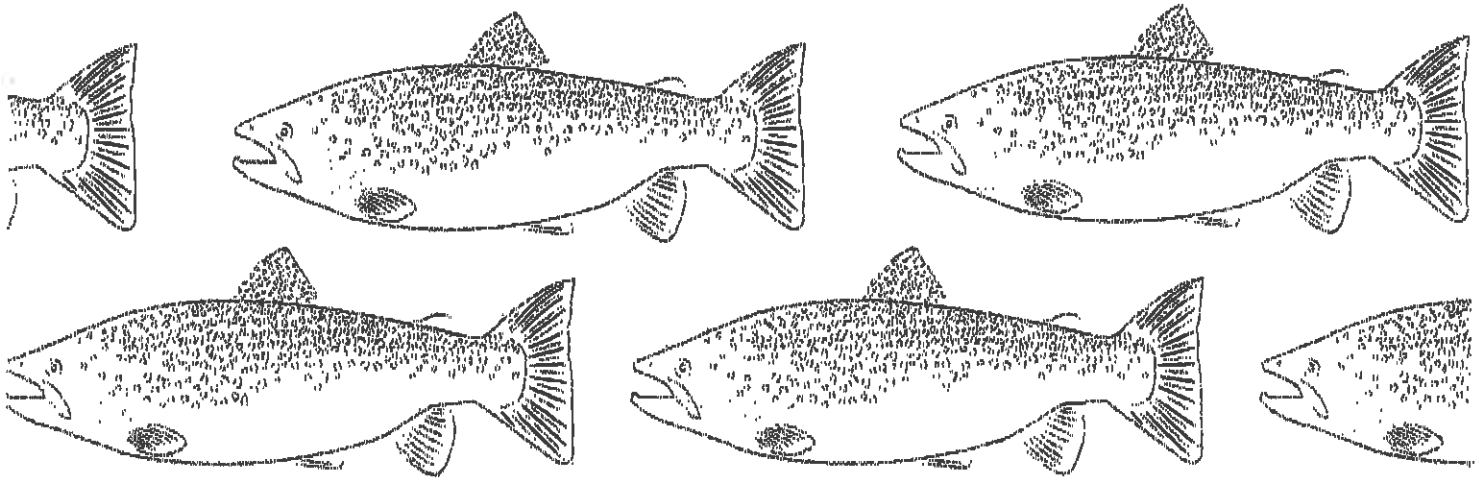

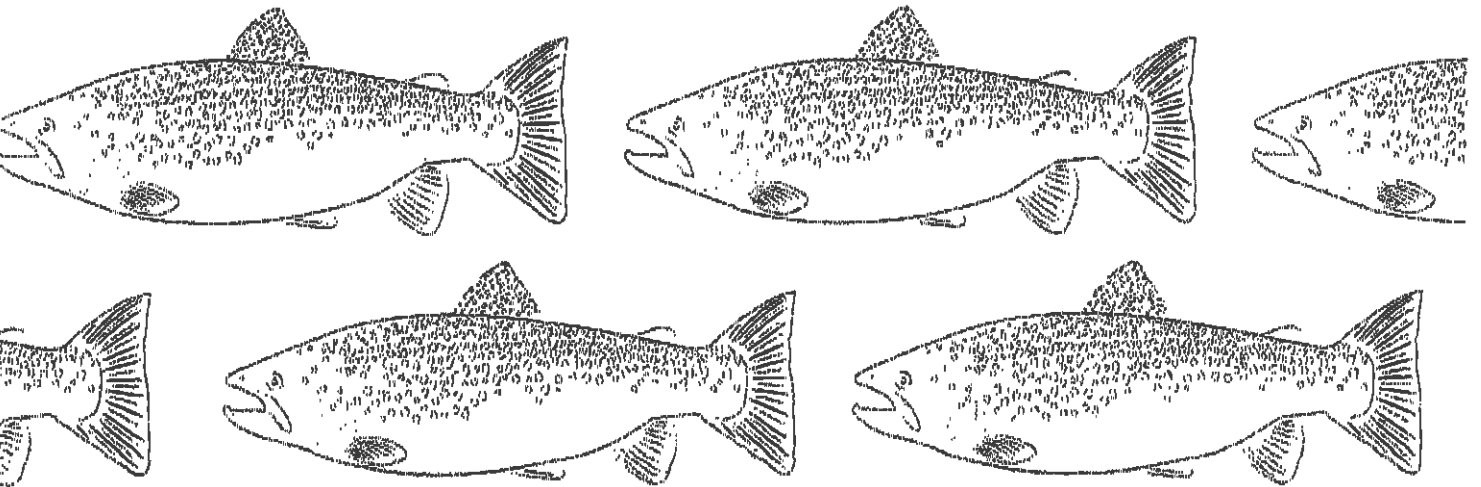

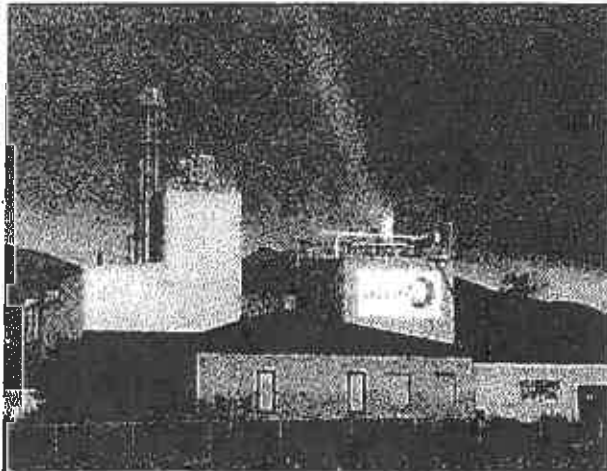

Fish feeds from Skretting meet the highest international standards and are produced in accordance with:

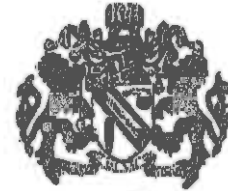
1. Canadian government law is outlined in the Feeds Act and the Feeds Regulations. U.S. government law is outlined in the Code of Federal Regulations and in local State regulations. All of the ingredients used in the manufacture of Skretting fish feeds are approved by the American Feed Control Officials and the Canadian Feed Inspection Agency as described in Schedule IV and V of the Feeds Regulations. Labeling, guaranteed analysis, and the associated tolerances for nutrient guarantees are carefully adhered to. Skretting feed plants are regularly inspected by the Canadian Feed Inspection Agency and by the U.S. FDA.
2. Guidelines from Skretting Aquaculture Research Center on salmon feed formulation. These guidelines have been developed as a result of our years of research into salmon nutrition and are updated frequently.
3. Feeds are manufactured in plants that are ISO 9001, GMP, BAP and HACCP certified. Daily nutritional testing is conducted and records are well maintained. Feed samples and raw materials are routinely analyzed and are retained for a 12 month period. Additional testing is conducted by external accredited labs. Skretting uses the NuTrace system to monitor quality and safety at all relevant stages of production and has tracking and tracing safeguards that meet all current legal requirements around the globe, including those of the European Union and FDA.
4. Skretting routinely measures dioxin, PCB, Heavy metals and pesticide levels in ingredients and final feed products. Where Canadian and U.S. standards are in place, for example for total Dioxins, Furans and Dioxins like PCB's levels (3 ng WHO- TEQ/kg in fish meal, 16 ng WHO- TEQ/kg in fish oil and 6 ng WHO- TEQ/kg in feed), we ensure that all our ingredients and our feed meet these standards. Skretting has stayed well beneath these levels and will continue to ensure that our feed and ingredients used to make the feed meet the most up to date recommended standards.



5. Skretting fully complies with Canadian and U.S. regulations in terms of the use of canthaxanthin and astaxanthin in salmon feed. The amount of pigment used is regulated in terms of the amount that can be added as a constituent ingredient of salmon or trout feed. According to current US FDA regulations, salmonid feed may contain maximum 80 ppm total pigment (can be 80 ppm astaxanthin or 80 ppm canthaxanthin or a combination of the two such that the total does not exceed 80ppm in the final feed). In Canada, canthaxanthin may be used up to 50 ppm and astaxanthin up to 80 ppm. The maximum total pigment is 80ppm (combined, all types). In practice, the amounts of astaxanthin and canthaxanthin used in salmon and trout feed produced by Skretting, are well within these limits.
6. Skretting uses only CFIA and U.S. FDA approved ingredients. Approved ingredients include some that are classed as genetically modified.
7. Approved ingredients are mixed together, ground, pass through an extruder in a hot process to form a pellet, and then dried. Dried pellets are then coated with oils via a vacuum coating process, cooled and packaged.
8. We do not now nor have we ever added growth hormones, sex hormones, or malachite green to Skretting feed. We do not use raw fish as an ingredient. We do not add any antibiotics as an ingredient to our non-medicated feed.
9. During the processing of our feed in extruders it is pasteurized at temperatures up to 110°C.
10. Feeds produced by Skretting North America do not contain meat meals, tallow or blood derived from ruminants or other materials considered to pose a risk of Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE).
11. Skretting feed plants in Vancouver BC, is Global G.A.P certified..

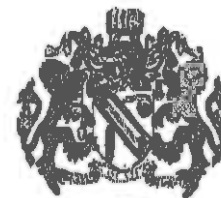

BEST AQUACULTURE PRACTICES CERTIFICATION

The following Best Aquaculture Practices standards and guidelines apply to facilities that process and manufacture finished feeds for the culture of fish, crustaceans and other aquatic animals.

The BAP standards are achievable, science-based and continuously improved global performance standards for the aquaculture supply chain that assure healthful foods produced through environmentally and socially responsible means. They are designed to assist program applicants in performing self-assessments of the environmental and social impacts, and food safety controls of their facilities, and to lead to third-party certification of compliance. For further information, please

refer to the additional resources listed.

BAP standards demand compliance with local regulations as the first step toward certification. However, not all regulations are equally rigorous. For this reason, BAP standards set out requirements for documentation and procedures that must be in facility management plans, whether they are prescribed by local regulations or not. By so doing, they seek, where possible, to impose consistency in performance among facilities in different producing regions and to engage the industry as a whole in a process of continuous improvement.

In common with ISO usage, these standards use the words “shall” to mean compliance is required and “should” to mean compliance is recommended. Auditable points are “shall” statements listed at the end of each standard.
